Ontario Private School Overseas – High School Diploma Requirements
 The Ontario high school program is based on a credit system. Students must earn a total of 30 Credits (one for every 110-hour course successfully completed) to obtain a high school diploma. Eighteen of the credits are compulsory, earned in a specified number of courses from a list of subjects that every student must take. The remaining 12 credits are optional, earned in course that the student may select from the full range of courses offered by the school.

 Community Involvement Activities – Check with school as to number of hours required.
 The Provincial Secondary School Literacy Test – must successfully complete the provincial secondary school literacy test in order to

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earn a secondary diploma.

While education benefits are very generous, history tells us those parents with students attending Residential school inside/outside Canada should be prepared to pay out-of-pocket non-reimbursable expenses in the neighbourhood of \$2,000.00 to \$5,000.00 per student per school year.
