On the night of 10/11 June 1944 two platoons of B Coy with supporting arms made a reconnaissance in force through a strongly held German defensive position, at the Bridge at Putot-en-Besson. Cpl (A/Sgt) Frost was acting as Platoon Sergeant of the left flanking Platoon. Before reaching the line of the railway, his Pl comd was made a casualty. Frost immediately took hold of the Platoon and showed outstanding leadership. He personally accounted for three of the enemy, and by coolly sighting he nearest Bren gun enabled his Platoon to continuate ward when pinned down by vicious cross-fire and cortar "stands". On returning to the Company area under heavy fire from heavy mortars and machine-guns, Frost came across remnants of the other platoon.
