On the 25th of October 1944, "B" Company had been fighting bitterly for twenty-four hours without Maj Gen cood of any kind. Private Gregor had made every Comd 2 Cdn Inf Div ffort to deliver the badly needed metions. Eventually he succeeded in getting them within half a mile of the Company positions by vehicle. Redizing it would be impossible to continue further, he stopped the vehicle and continued the remaining 4 (G G SIMONDS) Lt Gen distance on foot, carrying the heavy food containers. God oin Forces in the Without regard to his own personal safety and under Metherlands. extremely heavy mortar fire he cheerfully made several trips from the vehicle to the company in order to accomplish the task he had set himself.

When all the parties had been distributed forward, Private Gregor went from position to position delivering mail and eigerettes to the troops. At all times he exposed himself to extreme danger in order to bring these small comforts to the men of his company.

Private Gregor's actions were, at all times, a source of inspiration to the men and added much to the fighting efficiency of the company.
