On 25 July 1944 the Calgary Highlanders consolidated at St Andre Sur Orne under heavy shell and mortar fire which continued with only occasional brief pauses all that day and the night following. "D" Company was in a forward positionat the south edge of the village when heavy enemy artillery concentrations were brought diwn upon them causing casualties and wricking the buildings which they occupied. Private Lysne, a stretcher bearer, immediately went to the assistance of the casualties, rendered first aid treatment, rescued his comrades from the damaged buildings and evacuated them to positions of safety ignoring completely the dnager from falling debris and the continued heavy shell fire.
